March 4, 2017 – 6 Adar 5777

In Parashat Terumah, the people of Israel are called upon to contribute various materials which will be used for the construction of the Mishkan, the sanctuary. Materials such as gold, silver, brass, blue/purple/scarlet fine linen, and goats hair, ram skin died red, sealskin, acacia-wood, oil, spices, onyx stones, etc. The purpose of this sanctuary is stated as follows:

“They shall make for Me a Sanctuary, and I shall dwell amidst them.” (Exodus 25:8)

“ועשו לי משכן ושכנתי בתוכם”

Moses is given detailed instructions on how to construct this dwelling which will serve as a traveling sanctuary, as they begin their journey towards the Promised Land.

This Day in Jewish History—6 Adar



In 1273 BCE (Jewish year 2488), Moses completed his farewell address to the Jewish people, and God informed Moses that the day of his death was approaching (Deut. 31:14). Amazingly, the anniversary of Moses' completing his teaching coincides with the date in 1482 of the first printing of the standard format used for Jewish Bibles today: vowel signs, accents, translation (Targum), and Rashi commentary.

There are two months in the Jewish year that the entire month is either a joyful month or a sad month.

The month of Av, which includes the Fast of Tisha B'av, the saddest day on the Jewish calendar, renders the whole month into a month when we are commanded to reduce the level of joyful events. It has not been a lucky month for the Jewish people, as both Temples were destroyed and the Jewish people were exiled to all corners of the world.

On the other hand, the month of Adar, which started this past Monday, ushers in a period when we are commanded to increase the level of joy and happiness. Haman had planned to kill all the Jews of Persia and the miracle of Purim spared the Jews, as they were able to fight back and defeat Haman and their enemies. It is, therefore a lucky month. The beginning of redemption started in Adar, but it led to the full redemption, the Exodus from Egypt, a month later on the 15th of Nissan.
