Vayera - וירא November 19, 2016 – 18 Heshvan 5777

After his circumcision, Abraham is visited by 3 angels, whom he invites into his tent to rest and eat. One of the angels announces that, at this same time next year, Sarah will give birth to a son. Sarah laughs privately upon hearing this, whereupon the angel asks her why she laughs. Sarah denies this out of fear, but the angel says, "Nay; but thou didst laugh," which is why the child will be named Isaac.

God then tells Abraham that he is going to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah because of their wickedness. Abraham argues that the innocent should not be punished along with the guilty. Abraham bargains with God and it is finally decided that, even if only 10 righteous people are found in the city, God will not destroy it.

Two of the 3 angels arrive at Sodom (the 3rd having discharged His duty to announce the birth of Isaac) and Lot invites them into his home. The men of the city insist on taking them. Lot refuses, and the men are smitten with blindness. The angels announce God's plan to destroy the city and tell Lot and his family to leave. Lot is hesitant, but the angels insist and take him, his wife and daughters out. Lot escapes to (cont.)

the city of Zoar. God destroys Sodom and Gomorrah by raining down fire and brimstone. Although they were warned not to look back toward the city, Lot's wife looks back and turns into a pillar of salt.

Abraham and Sarah travel to Gerar in the south of the land. Abraham tells the king of Gerar, Abimelech, that Sarah is his sister. Abimelech takes her for himself, but God comes to him in a dream and orders him not to touch her and to return her to Abraham. Abimelech does so and gives them gifts.

Isaac is now born, as told by the angel, but is mocked by Ishmael, Abraham's son by Hagar. Sarah tells Abraham to send Hagar and Ishmael away. In the wilderness, Hagar cries out to God and God provides water for them both and assures her that Ishmael will be the father of a great nation.

God now calls upon Abraham to sacrifice Isaac on Mount Moriah. Abraham takes him there, binds him on the altar, and just before he strikes the fatal blow, an angel stops him and tells him that God now knows that Abraham truly fears God. Abraham sees a ram caught in the thickets by its horns and he sacrifices it in place of Isaac. The angel tells Abraham that God will keep his promise of making Abraham a great nation.

This Day in Jewish History—18 Heshvan



In 1938, Nazi leader Hermann Goering announced that in order to "solve the problem of the Jews," the African island of Madagascar was being considered as a giant ghetto for 4 million European Jews. The plan was seriously considered by Hitler in May 1940, in his discussions with Mussolini and Nazi officials. Hitler's idea was that the Jews would play the role of hostages, as a way to prevent the United States from entering the war.

The Madagascar Plan was cancelled due to a British blockade. One year later, it was decided that the "Final Solution to the Jewish Question" would mean extermination.
