## Parashat Haye Sarah

This week's parasha begins with Rebecca and Isaac wanting a child. They have been married for twenty years and are still childless. Isaac prays for Rebecca and his prayer is answered. They don't get just one child but a set of twins, two boys who are different in their physical appearance as well as in their character and the path they will choose in life. We read that Esau came out first, but his brother Jacob was holding to his brother's heel, as if to say, I want to be first. The struggle, as to who of the twins will inherit the birthright and continue the family's traditions, will last throughout their lives.

Isaac likes Esau but Rebecca likes Jacob. The first story tells of Jacob buying the birthright from Esau for a meal of bread and a stew of lentils.

There is a famine in the land of Canaan just like it happened during the days of Abraham. Isaac considers going down to Egypt, just like Abraham did; however, God appears to Isaac and instructs him not to go to Egypt but to remain in the land. God renews the promises made to Abraham and that they will be bestowed on Isaac and his descendants.

Isaac goes to Gerar in the land of the Philistines, where he prospers tremendously. The Philistines envy him and fill his wells with dirt. Isaac moves on towards Beer Sheva. When Isaac is old and almost blind, he asks his son Esau to prepare for him some game, so that he can bless him before he dies. Rebecca instructs Jacob to pretend that he is Esau so that he can get the blessings. This story of deceit will haunt Jacob and his descendants for years to come. It will force Jacob to flee to Haran in Mesopotamia.
