Restival of Shavuot - חג השבועות June 12 and 13, 2016 – 6 and 7 Sivan 5776

Bamidbar begins the fourth Book of the Torah. In Hebrew it's called 'Bamidbar'—in the wilderness—because of the first words of this book. In English it is called the Book of Numbers because the book begins with the census that was taken in order to know the number of men available to serve in the army that will be conquering the Promised Land.

Shavuot is also called 'Zman Matan Toratenu' - the Season of the Giving of the Torah. It is one of the three pilgrimage festivals connected to harvest and is known as 'Hag Habikurim' - the Festival of the First Fruits.

On Sunday—the first day of Shavuot—we will be reading the Ten Commandments. On Monday—the second day of Shavuot—we read the portion from the Torah that describes the various tithing people were commanded to give to the poor and the Levites as well as the Mitzvah of celebrating the Three Festivals. It is customary to read the Akdamot before the Torah Reading on the first day of Shavuot. Akdamot is a long poem written in Aramaic dealing with the greatness of God, the excellence of the Torah, and the future hope of Israel.

On the second day of Shavuot, it is customary to read the Book of Ruth, containing the story of Ruth the Moabite who converts to Judaism and is the great-grandmother of King David.

This Day in Jewish History—5 Sivan



In 1981, Israel bombed and destroyed the Iraqi nuclear reactor in Baghdad. Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein had pronounced himself as the reincarnation of Babylonian tyrant Nebuchadnezzar, and named the nuclear reactor

"Tammuz" -- the name of the calamitous Jewish month when Nebuchadnezzar's troops laid siege on Jerusalem 2,500 years earlier. Ilan Ramon (later to become Israel's first astronaut, who died in the explosion of the Space Shuttle Columbia) and seven other pilots executed the daring raid -- flying over enemy Arab territory for hours, and avoiding detection with their tight formation that emitted a radar signal resembling a commercial airliner. However, even as Israel celebrated the successful raid, condemnation was nearly universal. One prominent U.S. senator called it "one of the most provocative, ill-timed and internationally illegal actions taken in that nation's history." Two decades later, as the world feared Saddam's weapons of mass destruction, the Israeli action was vindicated.
