Hukat - חקת July 16, 2016 – 10 Tammuz 5776

The first chapter in this week's Parasha describes the very strange laws of the Red Cow.

The ashes of this cow, together with ashes from cedar wood, hyssop and crimson stuff, are mixed with water to prepare a potion that is used to purify someone who had come in contact with a dead body. Such a person is 'Tameh', unclean, and must wait seven days before entering the Temple. On the third and seventh day,, the priest sprinkles some of this water on the Tameh to make that person 'Tahor', pure/clean.

We are now in the final year of the forty years of wandering in the wilderness. As the Children of Israel approach the bordering nations of the Promised Land, they ask permission to go thru their country, and promise to pay for whatever they use during their passage. The Edomites refuse to let them thru, and so do the Emorites.

Miriam dies at the beginning of the 40th year during the month of Nissan. People cannot find any water and they gather around Moses and Aaron to demand water. Just like when it happened before, (cont.)

they complain that Moses misled them as they would have preferred to have stayed in Egypt where at least they had water.

The story of Moses and Aaron striking the rock instead of speaking to it to get water is also in this Parasha.

This Day in Jewish History—10 Tammuz



In 423 BCE, King Tzidkiyahu was captured by Babylonian troops in the plains of Jericho, as recorded in Jeremiah ch. 39. The evil Nebuchadnezzar forced Tzidkiyahu to witness the slaughter of his sons, and then Tzidkiyahu's eyes were gouged out. Till today, Tzidkiyahu is remembered as a righteous man, while Nebuchadnezzar -- like a long list of tyrants who sought to oppress the Jewish

people -- was degraded and reduced to the dustbin of history. The biblical Book of Daniel (4:30) describes how Nebuchadnezzar "was driven from mankind; he ate grass like oxen, and his body was washed by the dew of heaven, until his hair grew like eagles' feathers and his nails were like birds' claws." (Nebuchadnezzar later regained his sanity and returned to rule.)
