**Parashat Kee Tetze—ני-תצא—
September 14, 2019—14 Elul 5779**

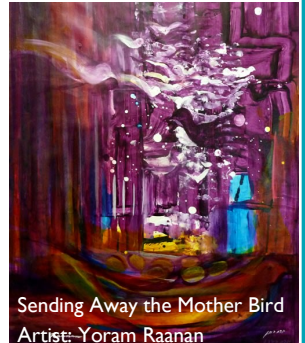
In Parashat Kee Tetze, Moses continues his instructions to the people of Israel, as they are about to enter the Promised Land.

This Parasha is loaded with Mitzvot—commandments, dos and don'ts—as if Moses wants to teach as much as he can on these last days of his life.

This Parasha contains 74 Mitzvot out of the 613 found in the Torah. They include laws on family life, laws requiring a finder to return an object to its rightful owner, and compassion and kindness to animals.

Emphasis is again placed on being kind and generous to those who are vulnerable—the poor, orphans, widows and strangers. Conduct during war and those who would be exempt from serving is also discussed.

The parasha concludes with the commandment of remembering Amalek. Amalek in the Torah represents an evil nation that attacked Israel when they left Egypt. The commandment urges us to always remember—ZACHOR—and to never forget what they did to our people. God promises that, someday, the remembrance of Amalek will be erased.

This Day in Jewish History— 7 Elul



In 1729, Congregation Shearith Israel laid a foundation stone in lower Manhattan for the first structure ever designed and built as a synagogue in continental North America. At the time, New York had the only Jewish community in the country; it would be some two decades later before organized Jewish settlement began in Philadelphia, Lancaster and Charleston. Shearith Israel was the only Jewish congregation in New York City from 1654 until 1825, having been founded by Brazilian Jews of Spanish and Portuguese origin. Governor Peter Stuyvesant, known for his anti-Semitic views, had initially denied Jews the right to worship in a public gathering; these Jews fought for their rights and won permission. Today, Shearith Israel occupies a grand structure at 70th Street and Central Park West.
